

> At the start of lockdown our priority was ensuring students were getting the information they needed from us and the College, and that we offered as much reassurance and opportunity for students to stay connected as possible. We therefore launched the campaign – 'SU are here for you'.






We prioritised sharing information about mental wellbeing and support services.

We worked with lecturer Simon Howes to share weekly Mindfulness videos, ran a socials campaign of mental health tips and advice and hosted a virtual chat twice a week.

We connected with local mental health charities across the borough to ask for advice around messaging and signposting details. We promoted to students that the counselling service at the College was still available.








We recognised that for some students their pets were the thing that kept them busy and mentally well. We offered for students to send us pics of their pets to feature on our 'Insta pet' feed.






And similarly to lots of voluntary sector organisations we hosted a weekly lockdown quiz which proved popular for current and alumni students.

The President election remained a priority in the SU calendar. We moved the entirety of the election process to an online virtual format. This included recording video hustings, a live candidate Q&A over Facebook, promotions across all social media and college platforms and an online only voting process through Blackboard.

We were pleased to be able to return to campus in September and open our doors once more (in a socially distanced way!). We continue to run services for our members including the Redbox Free sanitary scheme, SAFE sexual health appointments, Age ID and Student discount verification and act as a point of contact for any student experience related items.

Papyrus suicide prevention workshop

Papyrus is the national charity dedicated to the prevention of young suicide.

We hosted our first ever virtual Freshers Fayre. With over 30 different sessions students could participate in over a week period. We worked with 15 community organisations to help them share information about their work with students. We had great feedback from the organizations as they felt we had done a lot to support them to think about alternative ways of connecting with clients. This included support to host Facebook live events, supporting with the set up of social media accounts and giving them training on the usage of Microsoft Team events. All of the sessions were recorded and can either be accessed via IGTV, YouTube or Stream for Teams. We were very proud to be able to organise this type of event for the first time and although a steep learning curve it is now one which the staff team are all more confident running again in the future.



Once again the SU celebrated Colleges Week. Using the week as an opportunity to write to all local MP', 29 letters were sent to local constituency offices introducing the President and asking for support in highlighting the vital importance of colleges and all they do. The SU also used the opportunity to speak to local business owners about the campaign, asking them to recognise the importance of the College and student population.

We also decorated the BASE window with the Love Colleges logo.

- We ran a socials campaign to highlight Black
 History Month and we continue to populate a
 channel on Teams with information about Black
 History, including support organisations, arts
 projects, reading and song lists etc.
- We have worked with local LGBT plus support center the What BeeHIVe project over lockdown and have run a number of live chats with them over socials about varying topics.
- We have re established the social group 'We Socialise Too' a club predominantly for our Aspire learners. We have also organised an upcoming disability forum and have a disability committee that meets regularly to listen to and support the advocacy of disabled students.
