This report will highlight key areas of work under the DSU core themes and values which are:

Representation- The Students' Union aims to represent and advocate for the interests, concerns, and welfare of its members. This involves engaging with college administration, local and national authorities, and other stakeholders to ensure that students' voices are heard, and their needs are met.

Skills development- Encouraging student engagement and participation in the wider community through volunteering, fundraising, and other activities.

Creating community- Promoting diversity, inclusivity, equity and belonging among the student population and providing a range of sports, societies, and other extracurricular activities that help students to build social connections and develop new skills.

Representation- including campaigning, lobbying and liberation work.

As is tradition, the SU President dedicated the first week of term to engaging with students during Induction talks alongside the Principal and Vice Principal. Jack passionately conveyed the message of "Get Involved," which aligns with our broader branding strategy discussed later in this report. Over the course of the week, he spoke to approximately 3,000 students in back-to-back sessions, sharing his personal experiences of being shy, bullied and gay with openness and honesty. This authentic approach resonated deeply with students, and we



have since received numerous conversations from attendees expressing how Jack's speech inspired them to act and engage with the Students' Union. His efforts have undoubtedly set a positive tone for the year, motivating students to become active participants in our community!

One student messaged us this because of the talks "Hi Jack, I heard your speech about the Students Union earlier in the theatre, and it really caught my attention. I experienced bullying in secondary school for being black and bisexual, which led me to leave in Year 9 because I couldn't handle it anymore. In Years 10 and 11, I often felt excluded from friendship groups. I want to be part of the Students' Union because I understand what it's like to feel unworthy and isolated. I'm ready to step out of my comfort zone and be involved in a community that truly understands me and others like me."

Exciting Leadership Elections: Candidates Ready to Inspire Change!

Dudley Students' Union is thrilled to announce a record-breaking leadership election season! With 18 passionate candidates stepping up to represent and lead our student community, we have more participation than we've seen in years—an inspiring testament to the energy and engagement of Dudley students. Empowering Change: Highlights from NUS UK National Lobby Day



At the NUS UK National Lobby Day, Students' Union leaders from across the country came together to lobby their MP's on the issues affecting students, Jack went to meet with MP Sonia Kumar in Parliament to the conversation focused on the urgent need to strengthen renters' rights, particularly the abolition of guarantors, which often create barriers for students seeking safe and



affordable housing. By including students in broader housing protections, we can ensure that all young people have access to secure living conditions without the stress of unmanageable financial requirements. Additionally, they addressed the necessity for affordable and reliable transport, which is vital for students commuting to classes and jobs, allowing them to fully engage in their education and community. The advocacy for votes at 16 was another key topic, emphasising the importance of empowering young voices in the democratic process, which fosters civic

engagement and responsibility from an early age. Furthermore, discussions surrounding education reforms, particularly the proposed BTEC cuts, highlighted the significance of diverse educational pathways for students. These qualifications provide essential skills and opportunities for many young people, and their removal could limit future

career prospects. Overall, it was an incredible day of political change and collective action, demonstrating the power of student voices to influence policy



and drive meaningful reform that prioritises the rights and needs of the next generation.

Empowering FE Students: Highlights from the AOC Student Summit

We attended the FE Student Summit at Stafford College, hosted by the AOC, alongside student leaders from across the country. Throughout the day, we focused on what Students need from the next Government, contributing to the AOC's youth initiatives and the newly established FE Youth Collective Board. This collaborative effort aims to hold AOC decision-makers accountable while fostering strong relationships within the education sector. Our participation in this summit underscores our commitment to advocating for the needs of FE students and driving positive change within the community!

NUS UK Lead and Change: Empowering Student Leaders for Impact





In the Summer the SU President Jack attended the NUS UK Lead and Change program hosted at the University of Birmingham Guild of Students which is a training initiative designed

to empower student leaders across the UK with the skills, knowledge, and confidence to create positive change in their institutions and communities. This program provides the essential knowledge for leadership, campaign strategies, governance, and advocacy, equipping Jack to effectively represent Dudley students and address pressing issues facing them today. Through interactive workshops, expert-led sessions, and networking opportunities, Lead and Change fosters an environment where student leaders can share ideas, learn from one another, and build strong foundations for impactful, inclusive



leadership. By participating, Jack became more adept at navigating challenges, engaging stakeholders, and influencing policy within the education landscape. It's important to note that Dudley SU was the first Further Education SU to participate and send a delegate to this 3-day event proving how developed we are.

Meet the SU Crew: The Heart of Dudley Student Union

We are continuing our SU Crew initiative to support students and develop their skills through volunteering with the Union on projects, events and activities. The idea being that it's for students who want to get involved but don't necessarily want to take



on any leadership responsibility. This year we have launched our new SU Crew uniform; they will be striking a pose across all campuses in fiery orange having made their debut at Freshers and the recent Open Day.



Empowering Leaders in Small and Specialist Institutions at Dudley SU



On the 30th October, Dudley SU hosted the NUS UK small and specialist Lead and Change event tailored to FE and specialist Unions welcoming over 50 people to Dudley. This training brought SU Leaders together from Wales, Gower Swansea College to Leeds City College and Sheffield College. Through workshops and discussions led by experienced NUS facilitators, participants explored strategies to amplify their voices and drive meaningful change. We were joined by Amira Campbell the NUSK UK President and Qasim Hussain the NUS **UK Vice President of Further**

Education. Hosting this event at Dudley SU not only strengthened connections among like-minded student leaders but also showcased Dudley SU's commitment to fostering a collaborative, supportive network across Unions and ensures Dudley SU remains in the national picture and is a central part of the national student agenda.

Dudley SU Students Conquer Kinver: A Transformative Duke of Edinburgh Expedition



During July in the Summer Holidays students took their Duke of Edinburgh expedition around Kinver. They engaged in essential camp craft and navigation skills at Kinver Scout Camp. Many had never camped before or cooked independently, making the experience especially enriching. They learned to set up tents, prepare meals, and maintain a safe campsite while honing their map and navigation skills to plan effective routes. This hands-on experience fostered teamwork and problem-solving, culminating in a strong sense of achievement for all 12 participants upon



completing the expedition. Expedition assessor Kevin Whiting remarked, "The growth and confidence displayed by these young adventurers is truly inspiring; they've not only completed a challenging journey but have also built lasting skills and made memories to last a lifetime.

Advancing Leadership Skills with the CMI Level 5 Management Course

Jack has recently started a Level 5 CMI Leadership and Management course at the College to develop his skills and knowledge so he can lead the SU more effectively. This course covers essential topics such as strategic planning, performance management, effective communication, and team leadership. Students learn practical tools and frameworks for making informed decisions, motivating teams, and driving organisational success.

Dudley SU Secures Funding for Football Academy to Empower Youth and Prevent Violence

Dudley Students' Union successfully secured £2,000 to support the violence mitigation initiative promoted by the community voluntary service (CVS) during the summer holidays. We developed a project for the SU Football Club attendees named Football Development Academy which aimed to enhance physical fitness, teamwork, and skill development, while providing positive outlets for energy, fostering community spirit, and reducing idle time that could lead to negative behaviours.

Participant Feedback

Participants highlighted the program's positive impact on their mental health and behaviour. Key quotes include:

- "The football academy helped me stay focused and out of trouble."
- "Playing football made me feel happier and less stressed; I made new friends."
- "The coaches were supportive and kept us on the right path."
- "This program kept me busy and away from negative influences."

The Football Development Academy effectively engaged students, meeting its goals of skill development and violence reduction. Funding was crucial for this impactful program, and ongoing investment in similar initiatives is vital for sustaining positive community outcomes.





fund, highlighting our commitment to providing quality resources for our players.

This initiative is particularly important as the football club serves a majority of BAME students and those who may have faced challenges in joining official college teams, whether due to skill level or confidence. Additionally, many



participants have cited mental health difficulties, and we believe that embracing this diversity will strengthen our team and foster a supportive community. We are excited about the potential for personal growth and teamwork that this league will bring.

Youth Social Action Co-ordinator Aldrich Gonsalves Returns to Inspire ESOL Students Through Community Engagement

Youth Social Action Co-ordinator Aldrich Gonsalves has returned to his roots, re-engaging with the curriculum he first joined the college to study in 2016: English Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL). As part of the ESOL curriculum for the 16-18 year cohort, Aldrich will be delivering a structured program focused on Youth Social Action.

This classroom experience is particularly relevant as Aldrich has just completed his Initial Teacher Training Certificate in Education and Training, equipping him with the skills to effectively guide and support students.

They have also researched local organisations, gathering background information and identifying potential contacts to offer support for their initiatives.
