This report will highlight key areas of work under the DSU core themes and values which are:

Representation- The Students' Union aims to represent and advocate for the interests, concerns, and welfare of its members. This involves engaging with college administration, local and national authorities, and other stakeholders to ensure that students' voices are heard, and their needs are met.

Skills development- Encouraging student engagement and participation in the wider community through volunteering, fundraising, and other activities.

Creating community- Promoting diversity, inclusivity, equity and belonging among the student population and providing a range of sports, societies, and other extracurricular activities that help students to build social connections and develop new skills.

Representation- including campaigning, lobbying and liberation work.



NUS West Midlands Campaign Day & A Fair Deal for Our Future

We proudly attended the National Union of Students' Regional Campaign Day, where the focus was on empowering grassroots communities to tackle some of the most pressing national issues of our time. This event marked the powerful launch of the "Fair Deal for Our Future" campaign, which champions three fundamental pillars: fair future, fair education, and fair pay.

Dudley Students' Union is fully

committed to leading the charge in these areas. We will not stand by while apprentices are denied a real living wage, nor will we accept a system where



age determines the fairness of pay. We will demand a minimum wage for all, regardless of age, and an education system that serves students holistically, addressing their academic, personal, and financial well-being.

This campaign is more than a call for change—it's a demand for justice. As we stand at the forefront of this movement, we will fight relentlessly to ensure that every student, every worker, and every member of our community has the opportunities and support they deserve. The time for action is now, and we will be the force driving that change.

Sustainability embedded in Dudley SU

Dudley Students' Union has officially declared a Climate and Ecological Emergency, reaffirming our commitment to sustainability and empowering us to take meaningful action. As part of this pledge, we are actively reviewing and implementing an ethical procurement policy to ensure that our purchasing decisions align with our values. We are also taking steps to divest from Amazon, prioritising ethical and sustainable suppliers, and introducing a singleuse plastic reduction policy to minimise our environmental impact.

Leading our sustainability efforts, our Assistant President of Sustainability is organising a Fast Fashion Awareness Event on April 1st, highlighting the environmental and social consequences of the fashion industry and promoting sustainable alternatives. In addition, we have been at the forefront of promoting the Planet Earth Games, an initiative designed to engage and educate students on sustainability in a fun and interactive way. 

Student Parliament & Reform



Dudley Students' Union recently held a Student Parliament session that resulted in the approval of a comprehensive leadership and constitutional reform package. This significant development reflects the Union's commitment to enhancing its governance structures and ensuring that student representation remains robust and effective.

Role of the Student Parliament

The Student Parliament serves as the governing body of the Students' Union, making key

decisions about its operations and priorities. Discussions and decisions at Student Parliament typically focus on:

• How the Students' Union operates, including its processes and policies.



- New initiatives, campaigns, or projects the Students' Union should undertake.
- Allocation of resources, ensuring they are used effectively to benefit the student body.

Additionally, Student Parliament addresses questions submitted by student members and provides updates from elected representatives on their ongoing work.

Implications of the Reform Package



The approval of the leadership and constitutional reform package signifies a pivotal moment for the SU. The Reform Package includes:

• Enhanced Governance Structures: Implementing clear policies and procedures to

ensure transparency and accountability in decision-making.

- Strengthen Student Representation: Ensuring that elected leaders effectively advocate for the student body's interests and the roles available reflect student needs.
- **Promote Inclusivity**: Creating an environment where all students feel represented and valued.
- Improve Operational Efficiency: Streamlining processes to better serve the student community.

The Student Parliament's decision to approve the leadership and constitutional reform package underscores the union's dedication to continuous improvement and responsiveness to student needs. By refining its governance framework, the SU aims to foster a more inclusive, transparent, and effective organisation that truly embodies its mission of being run by students, for students.

Support for Trans+ Members & the Creation of a Gender Expression Fund



The **Gender Expression Fund** at Dudley Students' Union is designed to support students in expressing their gender identity with confidence and dignity. This initiative provides financial assistance to help students access essential items such as clothing, makeup, binders, packers, and other gender-affirming resources. By removing financial barriers, the fund ensures that all students can feel comfortable and authentic in their identity, fostering an inclusive and supportive campus environment.

Alongside the fund, Dudley SU also offers educational resources and advocacy to promote awareness and understanding of gender diversity, reinforcing its commitment to equality and student well-being.

Dudley SU supports its Trans and Non-Binary members and has released a public statement condemning the Governments action to ban access to life saving puberty blockers. The Statement can be read here: <u>Statement-on-Puberty-Blocker-Ban.pdf</u>

Knife Bin Campaign

The **Knife Bin Campaign** is a vital initiative aimed at tackling knife crime by providing a safe and anonymous way for individuals to dispose of weapons. In collaboration with local authorities, the MP for Dudley and community partners, the campaign raises awareness about the dangers of carrying knives while promoting safer communities.

The idea being a bin will be placed in a designated spot within the community which



will allow students and the wider public to surrender

knives without fear of prosecution, reducing the risk of violent incidents.

Dudley SU is committed to fostering a culture of safety and responsibility, ensuring that people are informed about the consequences of knife crime and the importance of making positive choices.





As part of this vital campaign, we've proudly partnered with St John Ambulance to deliver the **Young Responder: Save a Life** training program. This initiative equips our students with essential, real-world first aid skills—empowering them to respond effectively to emergencies, including treating stab wounds, managing intoxication, and recognising mental health crises.

So far, we have successfully trained two cohorts—50 students in total—arming them with the confidence and expertise to make a real difference in their communities. This is more than just training; it's about creating a safer, more prepared generation ready to step up when it matters most.

Meet the Leadership Team

The Dudley Students' Union has a brand-new leadership team, ready to tackle key student issues and make meaningful changes on campus. Following a hardfought election campaign, the newly elected representatives have secured a strong mandate from the student body, placing them in a prime position to advocate for student needs.



The leadership team has laid out ambitious manifesto aims, focusing on areas such as improved mental health resources, better access to student clubs and



societies, enhanced enrichment opportunities, and continued efforts to address the cost-of-living crisis. Their commitment to these issues reflects the concerns voiced by students throughout the campaign period.

"We are here to ensure students' voices are heard and acted upon," said Vice President Usman Shahid. "Our goal is to make tangible improvements in student life, and we are eager to get started on fulfilling our promises."

The Students' Union plays a crucial role in representing the student community and advocating for policy changes that enhance the college experience. By working closely with students, college management, and external organisations, the new team aims to drive forward initiatives that will have a lasting impact.

Holding Power to Account

Local Member of Parliament Sonia Kumar (Dudley constituency) attended an in-person event with students, where she engaged in an insightful and interactive discussion.

The event provided students with the unique opportunity to ask MP Kumar questions on a wide range of topics, including education, homelessness, and community initiatives. The session was both engaging and thought-provoking, allowing students to gain firsthand insights into the workings of government and public service.

MP Kumar expressed her enthusiasm for connecting with young people and encouraging their involvement in political discourse.

Students in attendance appreciated the chance to voice their concerns and gain clarity on key issues. Many described the session as informative and motivating. One



student commented, *"It was great to speak directly with our MP and hear her thoughts on important topics. This kind of engagement really makes a difference."*

The event at Dudley Lecture Theatre was part of MP Kumar's ongoing efforts to connect with her constituents and promote civic engagement among young people.

Training Colleges in Youth Social Action

The training of colleges in Youth Social Action (YSA) has been an integral initiative aimed at empowering students to become active changemakers in their communities. Led by Aldrich and supported by Sophia and Jack, YSA

training has been delivered to a number of colleges from across the region equipping their students with the knowledge and tools needed to effectively deliver YSA programs, ensuring that young people have the opportunity to engage in meaningful activities that positively impact society and the environment.



Aldrich plays a crucial role in this work as an Association of Colleges (AoC) YSA mentor, supporting both YSA apprentices and colleges looking to embed youth social action within their institutions. Through mentorship, workshops, and guidance, Aldrich helps colleges navigate the challenges of implementing YSA, ensuring they can harness the energy, creativity, and fresh perspectives of young people to drive positive change.

Youth social action refers to activities undertaken by young individuals to improve the lives of others or enhance environmental sustainability. By participating in these initiatives, students not only contribute to their communities but also develop essential skills such as leadership, teamwork, and problem-solving. Organisations benefit immensely from the enthusiasm and innovative thinking of young people, which can lead to new ways of working and fresh approaches to tackling social issues.

The training creates an environment where young people feel empowered to make a difference. By fostering collaboration between students, colleges, and



community organisations, this initiative is helping to cultivate a generation of socially responsible and active citizens who are committed to positive change.

Class Representatives: Driving Positive Change

Class representatives play a pivotal role in shaping the student experience, acting as a vital link between students and staff. Following Term 1 meetings across all curriculum areas, an impressive 300 items plus have been raised by class reps, reflecting the breadth of their engagement and commitment to improving college life. These items, ranging from suggestions on teaching and learning to enhancements in the campus environment, are now being addressed by managers across the college.

This level of collaboration highlights the importance of the student voice in cocreating a thriving educational community. By working closely with their peers to identify key areas for development, class reps ensure that every voice is heard and valued. Their efforts help create a dynamic feedback loop, fostering a partnership approach between students and staff.

Student Governors & the Association of Colleges

Each year, the Association of Colleges (AoC) hosts its Annual Conference, which brings together senior leaders from the further education sector across the country. This event serves as an invaluable platform for professionals to share best practices, engage in thought-provoking discussions, and take part in professional development activities. The conference also offers an opportunity for attendees to collaborate on solutions to the common challenges faced by colleges today, ensuring that institutions continue to adapt and thrive in an ever-changing educational landscape.





In addition to the Annual Conference, the AoC organises the Governors' Summit, a unique event that brings together Student Governors from colleges nationwide. This summit focuses on empowering student leaders by equipping them with the key skills necessary to contribute effectively to meetings, engage in meaningful discussions, and collaborate on solving the critical issues that affect students. It also fosters the creation of lasting connections between student governors, allowing them to share experiences and support one



another in their roles.

At this year's Governors' Summit, Jack Stokes, your President and Student Governor, alongside Deborah Ibojo, the Student Governor, attended to gain knowledge into effective governance. Following the summit, Deborah was appointed as the Chair of Dudley Students' Union, a role in which she has excelled. Deborah has demonstrated exceptional leadership in chairing our Leadership Team Formal Meetings and, more recently, our Student Parliament. She has been instrumental in ensuring the smooth running of these meetings, facilitating open and

inclusive discussions, and ensuring that every voice is heard. We are proud of the progress she continues to help us achieve.

Operational Planning for the Future

Last year, we launched our Strategic Plan, setting out a bold and ambitious vision for the future of Dudley Students' Union. This plan serves as a roadmap, guiding our priorities and ensuring that we continue to grow, evolve, and deliver meaningful change for our students. We are well on the way to completing the first Operational Development Plan, making significant progress in turning our strategic priorities into tangible outcomes. By taking this structured approach, we can track our progress, remain adaptable



to the changing needs of students, and ensure that every decision we make directly contributes to our long-term vision. Through this commitment, we are actively shaping a stronger, more responsive, and student-focused Dudley Students' Union.

New Approach to Supporting Student Leaders



Following a comprehensive review of the training and support framework for the Executive Team, we have implemented significant changes to enhance the development and performance of student leaders.

Executives are now required to dedicate a minimum of 2 hours weekly in the office to plan and work on campaigns. This structured commitment fosters better collaboration, accountability, and

campaign effectiveness.

All executives attended a leadership residential program to build critical skills. The topics covered included the Nolan Principles supporting the understanding ethical leadership values, the Art of Conversation and Debate to support in enhancing communication and negotiation skills and manifesto development, where leaders shared manifesto aims with one another and discussed next steps. The program provided leaders with the tools to approach their roles with confidence and clarity.





In addition, regular one-to-one sessions with staff have been introduced to evaluate performance, reflect on progress, and offer personalised guidance. These sessions ensure continuous development and alignment with the strategic plan.

We hope this refreshed approach supports student leaders in becoming more effective, ethical, and well-prepared. With structured commitments, immersive



training, and performance evaluation, leaders can deliver impactful campaigns and drive positive change.

These changes mark a new era in leadership support, equipping student leaders with essential skills and resources while fostering personal growth and accountability. This initiative lays a foundation for sustainable success for both current and future leadership teams.

Lessons from Auschwitz

The SU remains dedicated to supporting the *Lessons from Auschwitz Project*, led by the Holocaust Education Trust. This year,

photography students Lilliana and Kaysie have been selected as our ambassadors.

Through this initiative, they will deepen their understanding of the Holocaust and its ongoing significance in today's world. The project includes a one-day visit to Poland, complemented by orientation and follow-up seminars, ensuring a powerful and reflective experience. The students are now working on a Next Steps project which will help share their experience with fellow students.

By taking part, students not only gain valuable insights but also develop leadership skills, carrying forward the legacy of Holocaust survivors. As ambassadors, they play a vital role in preserving these stories and educating others beyond the classroom.
